

Mott Middle College Program Commitment

Mott Middle College (MMC) is a public high school that is also an early college. It is important that students and their parents/guardians understand the benefits and risks inherent to this program

- Each student must:
 - Be enrolled in high school for a total of 5 years.
 - Update their Educational Development Plan (EDP) yearly.
 - Complete all required testing.
 - Complete the internship/project/career experience during in the student's 5th year.
 - Complete the MMC re-enrollment process each spring.
 - Complete student GAPS
- All students are required to earn a minimum of 15 college credits in order to earn a high school diploma. However, 15 college credits is a minimum, the goal is to earn an associates degree &/or 60 transferable college credits.
- Dually enrolled students are truly college students, Therefore:
 - Poor or failing grades in a college class permanently stay on the student's college record.
 - A college grade point average below 2.0 results in the student being placed on academic probation at the college.
 - Parental questions or concerns regarding college issues need to go through the high school counseling office.
- In order to re-enroll for any subsequent fall semester at MMC, students are required to exhibit academic and social progress sufficient to indicate likely completion of the program. This includes proper distribution of high school credits, accumulation of college credits, as well as evidence of social/behavioral maturity.
- Parent(s) – at least one must:
 - Complete all required paperwork
 - Must provide birth certificate and social security number
 - Complete Parent GAPS
